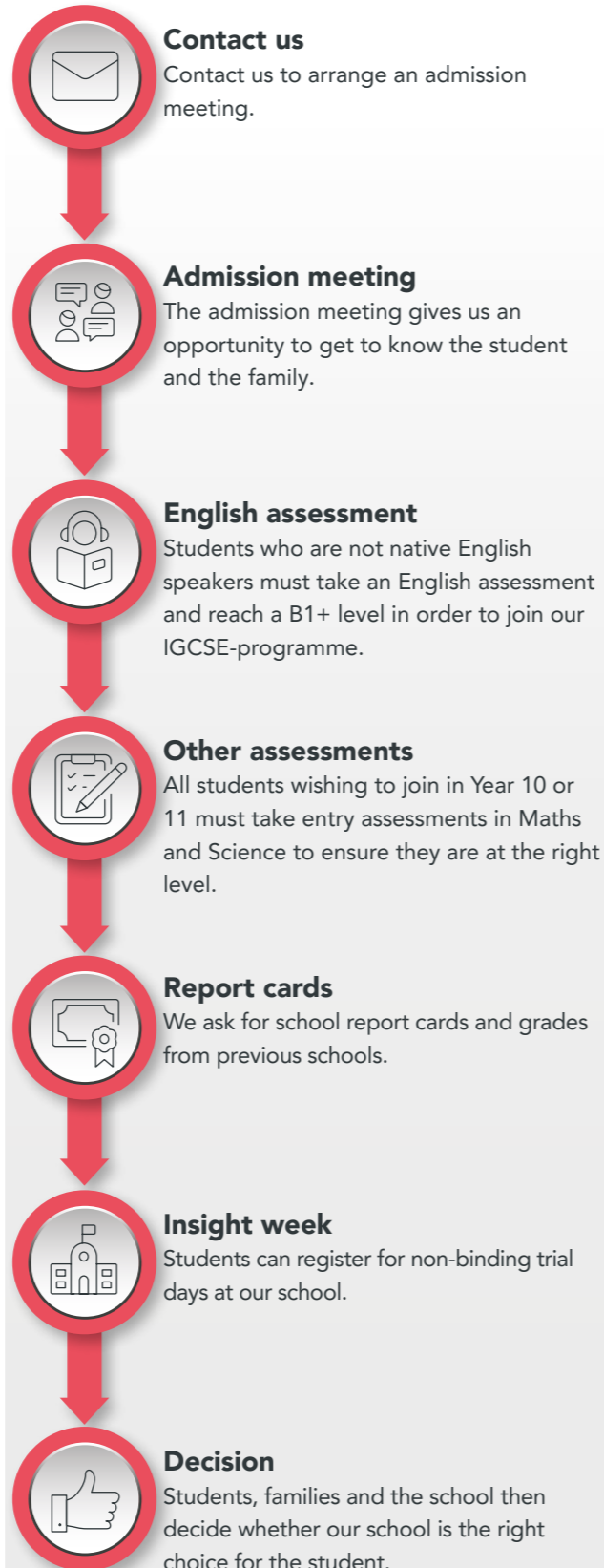

Pre-IGCSE-programme

We provide a unique curriculum blending the well-established British international curriculum with a highly innovative and unique approach to German. All academic subjects are taught in English. However, a considerable part of our teaching time is dedicated to German by layering our curriculum with project-based learning. This means that students not only attend language lessons, but also work on projects for other academic subjects, such as Sciences or Humanities, thus building a rich specialised vocabulary.

German Booster

For students wishing to apply to Swiss universities or simply to integrate into the community more easily we offer a Swiss university track for an additional school fee.

The German Booster track means students will receive 5 German lessons a week: 3 lessons at A1 beginner level, which will progress to A2 level, and 2 lessons that follow the IGCSE syllabus.

Higher and further education counselling

Our small team of staff including our head of school take great care to guide students through their final few years at school. We look at student's interests and abilities to help them in choosing higher and further educational pathways in Switzerland and the rest of the world. We have successfully guided a great many students through these pathways and have experience counselling and preparing students for UK, US, European and Swiss higher education. We also have a sound knowledge of the Swiss educational landscape and can advise on how our qualifications can lead to vocational pathways.

Electives and extracurricular activities

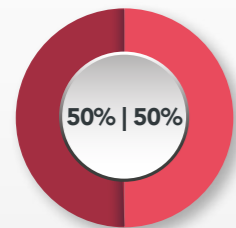
Elective	Description
Art	We offer over 2 hours of art a week in our 7th floor art studio. The studio is also available to keen artists most of the week so that they can develop their work and portfolios in a relaxed manner.
Computer Science	Our ICT teacher follows the IGCSE Computer Science curriculum in a relaxed manner. Students learn coding and can work at their own pace.
Drama and Literature in German for Native Speakers	Explore German literature in combination with Drama lessons with our German teacher who has a professional acting background.
Duke of Edinburgh Award	We run the Duke of Edinburgh Award which is a highly regarded international award for students. The award includes sport, new skill development, voluntary work and expeditions.
Football	We provide weekly football training at Rankhof stadium in Basel. The stadium has all the facilities needed for year-round Football training.
Gardening Club	In our hugely popular Gardening Club our students can design and develop inner city balcony gardens, indoor green spaces and plant based decorations.
Mindfulness Meditation	We have several qualified and experienced mindfulness and wellbeing coaches on staff who are able to offer Mindfulness Meditation on request in both English and German.
Model United Nations	Model United Nations, also known as Model UN or MUN, is an extra-curricular activity in which students typically roleplay delegates to the United Nations and simulate UN committees.
Music	We offer a weekly music class which is designed so that a variety of students can access and enjoy music. The class is not exam driven or theoretical but focuses on music, creativity, relaxation and expression.

Elective	Description
Newsletter	The school newsletter is edited by one of our English teachers. Budding journalists and reporters from the student body can participate in the creation of the monthly on-line newsletter.
Peer Tutoring	We have an active peer-tutoring-system in our school. Many of our older A-Level-students who are participating in the Duke of Edinburgh Award peer tutor younger students particularly in Maths, Science and German.
Prom and Event Committee	This committee is a group of senior students who spend the year learning about event management. They play a major role in planning the end of year prom and are involved in everything from deciding the prom 'theme' to ordering food.
STEAM	Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths. Our Science teachers lead this weekly elective where students work in the art studio to produce 3D models, robots and other physical representations of their work in science. Students are able to apply their mathematical and scientific understanding to exciting inventions and creations. This year they are involved in the challenging, yet exciting balloon launch to space.
Student Council	The Student Council comprises a cross section of students who represent the wider student body. They can raise issues and communicate with staff. They also contribute to the school by organising games evenings, bake sales and charity events.
Yoga and Stretch	We have a dedicated 'movement room' in our school. The room has soft mats and basic gym equipment enabling students to do gentle exercises. There is also a boxing punch bag which can be helpful to release energy. The room is always under adult supervision.

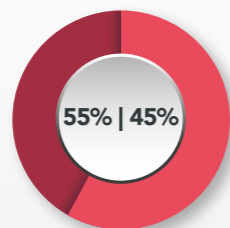

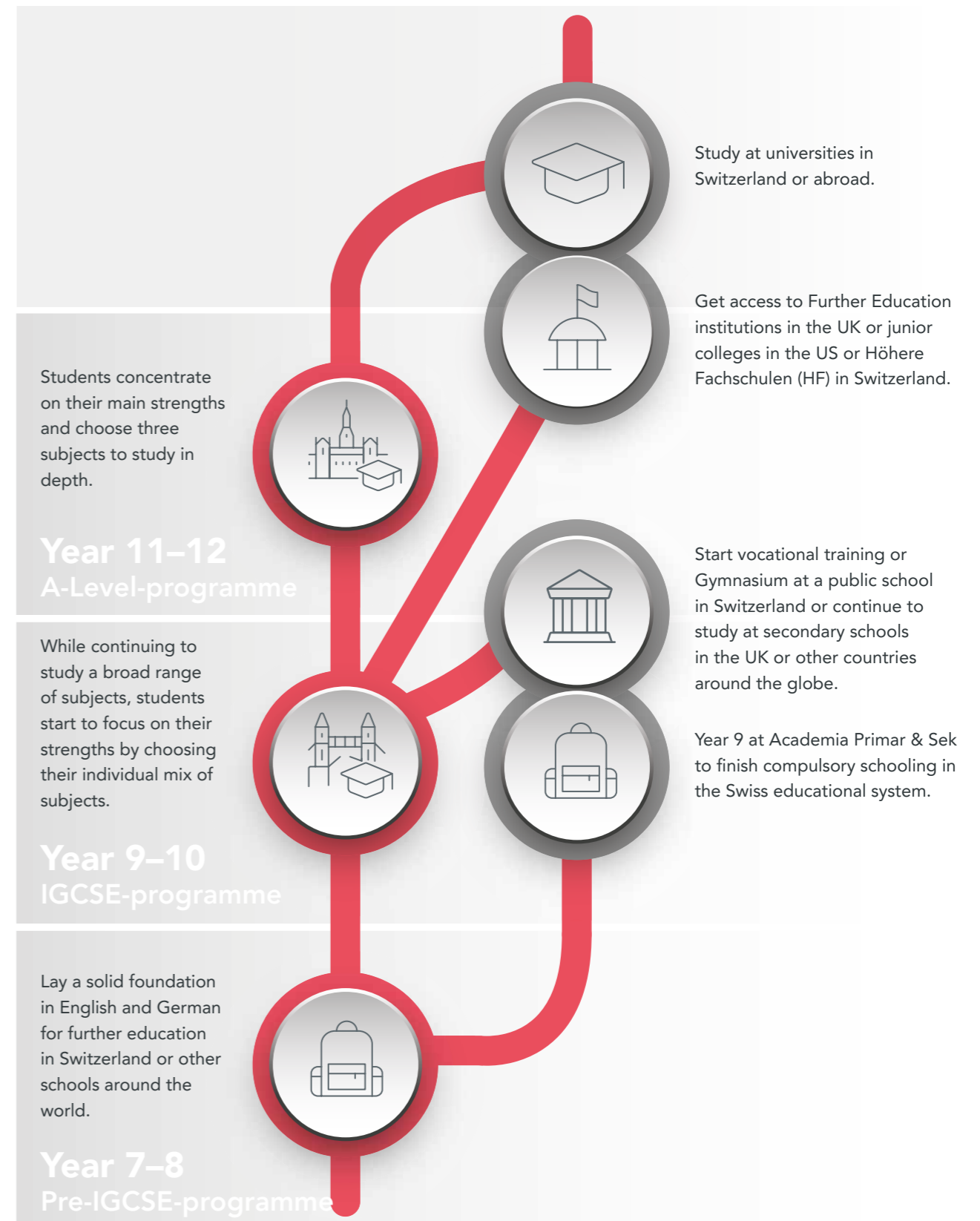
